ALL OF THE STUDENTS ARE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES OR THE EQUIVALENT. TOURS THROUGH THE IRON FOUNDRY, SCREW MACHINE, CYLINDER AND PADLOCK AND INTEGRALOCK DEPARTMENTS WERE FOLLOWED, AFTER A BRIEF REFRESHMENT PERIOD, BY A MEETING AT WHICH WAS SHOWN, WITH VISUAL AIDS, HOW THE COMPANY'S 1948 SALES DOLLAR WAS EXPENDED (I.E. WHO GETS WHAT), AND THE PARTS PLAY-ED BY THE STOCKHOLDER, THE CUSTOMER AND THE EMPLOYEE IN THE COMPANY'S BUSINESS AS IN AMERICAN ENTER-PRISE. IT WAS ALSO STATED THAT MORE THAN TWO-THIRDS OF THE NINE MILLION DOLLARS OF SALES WERE SPENT IN NEW HAVEN IN THE FORM OF PAYMENTS TO EMPLOYEES AND FOR MATERIALS AND SERVICES. JOSEPH BRADFORD SARGENT (1822-1907), GRANDFATHER OF YE EDITOR'S GENERATION, WROTE THE FOLLOW-ING LETTER FROM HONGKONG OCTOBER 5, 1887, DURING HIS FIRST ROUND-THE-WORLD TRIP TO JOHN SMITH SARGENT OF CHICAGO. THE LATTER WAS SEEKING TO TRACE THE ENGLISH ANCESTRY OF THE FAMILY, AND "J.B." UNDOUBTEDLY HOPED THAT THE NEWSPAPER CLIPPING WHICH HE ENCLOSED MIGHT SUPPLY A "LEAD". THE SUCCESSFUL RESULTS OF JOHN SMITH SARGENT'S EFFORTS WERE PUBLISHED IN THE 1895 EDITION OF THE SARGENT GENEALOGY. "JOHN SARGENT ESQ DEAR SIR: I FIND IN THE HONGKONG PAPERS OF SEPT 29 AN ACCOUNT OF THE MARRIAGE OF MISS ANNIE SARGENT TO MR. (OR LIEUT) EDGAR RAVENHILL IN THE VILLAGE CHURCH OF NORTH CRAY, WHICH I SUPPOSE TO BE IN SCOTLAND - OR PERHAPS ENGLAND. THE ACCOUNT IS FROM THE 'ERITH OBSERVER' AND I THINK ERITH IS A SCOTCH NAME (MAYBE WELSH) FOR A TOWN. BUT IT SEEMS THAT THE RESIDENCE OF GENL SARGENT IS IN KENT AND IT WAS FROM THIS LITTLE EDEN OF KENT THAT THE BRIDE LEFT ABOUT MIDDAY TO JOIN HER LIFE WITH ANOTHER &C - THE COUNTY OF KENT IN ENGLAND MAY BE THE PLACE IN WHICH THE VILLAGE CHURCH OF NORTH CRAY IS SITUATED. I PRESUME THIS SCRAP HAS NO MORE VALUE FOR YOU THAN FOR ME, UNLESS YOU CAN MAKE A CONNECTION BETWEEN THE CHERRYVALLEY FAMILY AND THE FAMILY OF THE BRIDE, WHO IT SEEMS HAS NUMEROUS FRIENDS IN THIS COLONY OF HONGKONG. I MAY ADD THAT THIS COLONY OF HONGKONG HAVE ONE OF THE LCVELIEST SPOTS IN ALL ASIA TO LIVE IN, AND I HAVE NEVER SEEN SO LOVELY A COUNTRY AS A LARGE PART OF JAPAN, CHINA AND THEIR MYRIADS OF ISLANDS. THE BUILDINGS OF HONGKONG ARE ON THE AVERAGE VERY GRAND AND IM-POSING STRUCTURES OF GRANITE OR CLOSE IMITATIONS. THE ENTIRE FOREIGN, BUSINESS AND RESIDENTIAL, POR-TION BEING OF THAT CLASS, BEGINNING AT THE WATER FRONT AND EXTENDING BACK AND UP THE STEEP MOUNTAINS AS HIGH UP AS EARTH COVERS THE ROCK SUFFICIENTLY FOR TREES TO GROW. IT REQUIRED MUCH ENGINEERING SCIENCE TO BUILD THE WINDING AND CLIMBING ROADS UP AND ON THE WHOLE FACE OF THE MOUNTAIN AND TO BUILD THE WALLS THAT SUPPORT THE HOUSES AND GROUNDS ON THE UPPER SIDES OF THE STREETS & ROADS. IT IS A WIND-ING (WITH THE 'I' SHORT) AS WELL AS A WINDING (WITH THE 'I' LONG) ROAD UP THE STREET AND ROADS. CONSEQUENCE NEARLY ALL THE TRAVELLING OF THE MERCHANTS &C AND THEIR FAMILIES BETWEEN 'DOWNTOWN' AND IN THE RESIDENCES HIGHER UP IS BY CHAIR BEARERS, WHO WITH THEIR CHAIRS ARE THICK AS GRASSHOPPERS IN KANSAS. (HERE HE DREW A PEN PICTURE OF A CHAIR. - ED.) THERE ARE A FEW JINRICKSHAS, BUT THEY ARE USE-LESS EXCEPT ALONG THE STREETS NEAR THE WATER AND PARALLEL WITH IT. ASIA IS A GREAT COUNTRY OF UN-EXCELLED FERTILITY OF SOIL AND PLEASANTNESS OF CLIMATE. THE CROPS THAT ARE ANNUALLY TAKEN FROM THE SOIL WOULD MAKE A BRAGGING WESTERNER OF THE UNITED STATES BLUSH IF THERE IS ANY BLUSH IN HIM. AS TO THE 'HEATHEN' INHABITANTS THEIR SENSE OF AND PRACTICE OF HONEST JUSTICE IN THEIR DAILY LIFE AND DEALINGS WITH EACH OTHER IS A GOOD 'COPY' FOR THE CHRISTIAN WORLD TO TRY TO IMITATE AS CLOSELY AS POSSIBLE. WHILE MANY OF THE CITIES OF CHINA SEEM OVERCROWDED, THE COUNTRY AS A WHOLE IS NOT VERY THICKLY PEOPLED AND IS CAPABLE OF SUSTAINING BY ITS AGRICULTURAL CAPABILITIES MANY TIMES ITS PRESENT POPULATION, AND THE AVERAGE OF HUMAN HAPPINESS IN CHINA AND JAPAN IS MUCH GREATER THAN IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. SUFFERING FROM POVERTY IS A CONDITION ALMOST ENTIRELY UNKNOWN HERE. FOOD IS EXCEEDINGLY PLENTY AND VERY CHEAP. RICE NOT HALF THE PRICE IN AMERICA, AND MEATS NOT HIGHER THAN IN THE COUNTRY OUT WEST'. FISH VERY PLENTY & CHEAP. CRIME IS VERY RARE, AND ITS PUNISHMENT IS CERTAIN, MERCILESS AND IMMEDIATE. THE POOREST COOLEY BOY CAN BECOME A MANDARIN IF HIS ACQUIREMENTS IN KNOWLEDGE ARE EQUAL TO THE POSITION. THERE IS NO LAW NO CASE NO CUSTOM THAT HOLDS BACK THE SON OF A COOLEY. ALL GOVERNMENTAL OCCUPATIONS ARE FILLED BY MEN WHO HAS PASSED EXAMINATIONS NOT IN PERSON, NOT BEING SEEN, BUT BY WRITTEN ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS AND PROPOSITIONS, THE JURY NEVER KNOWING ANYTHING WHATEVER OF THE PERSONALITY OR PLACE OF RESIDENCE OR NAME OF THE CANDIDATES. TWICE A YEAR THE WHOLE CHINESE EMPIRE IS THROWN OPEN TO CAN-DIDATES FOR ADVANCEMENT. THEY GO FORWARD STEP BY STEP, YEAR BY YEAR, ATTAINING AS HIGH RANK AS THEY ARE CAPABLE OF OR AS THEIR CIRCUMSTANCES WILL ALLOW TIME FOR STUDY. RECORDS ARE KEPT OF EACH MANS NUMBER, BUT HIS IDENTITY IS OTHERWISE UNKNOWN. ABILITY TO CONTROL THE VOTE OF HIS WARD DOES NOT COUNT IN CHINESE GOVERNMENT. THE UNITED STATES COULD COPY CHINA TO GREAT ADVANTAGE TO THE PURITY OF POLITICS, AND THEN MAKE AN IMPROVEMENT OVER THE CHINESE METHOD BY REQUIRING SOME PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE IN BUSINESS LIFE AS WELL AS LITERARY ABILITY, THE TEST OF THE CHINA METHOD. I AM AFRAID I HAVE WRITTEN A LETTER WHICH I DID NOT INTEND TO DO. MY WIFE AND I ARE IN A NO 1 TIP TOP HEALTH. HAVE BEEN IN PEKIN TWO WEEKS AND TRAVELLED NORTH OF THERE THROUGH THE GREAT WALL TO THE VALLEY BEYOND, HERDING AT NIGHT WITH THE CAMELS, MULES, HORSES DONKEYS SHEEP GOATS DOGS MONGOLIANS MANCHURIANS AND OTHER HEATHEN IDOLATERS FOR FOUR NIGHTS, WITH NO ONE ELSE WHO COULD SAY A WORD IN ANY EUROPEAN LANGUAGE EXCEPT OUR CHINESE SERVANT WHO HAD MASTERED A FEW ENGLISH WORDS, - ENOUGH TO UNDERSTAND OUR NECESSITIES FOR COOKING AND SLEEPING. WE NEVER HEARD A SWEAR WORD NOR A HUMAN GROWL. NO QUARRELING, NO DRINKING, NO HOGGISHNESS NOR SELFISHNESS. EVEN THE GREAT DROVES OF BLACK HOGS APPEARED TO BE MADE UP OF UNSELFISH ANIMALS, AND THE CAMELSLOOKED AS GENTLE AND MILD EYED AS LAMBS. AN IMMENSE TRAFFIC IS CARRIED ON PACK ANIMALS AND CARRIED IN NO OTHER WAY. WE EXPECT TO STEAM SOUTH OCT. 8TH, THROUGH AND AMONG THE MOST EASTERN OF THE EAST INDIA ISLANDS, THROUGH TORRES STRAITS TO AUSTRALIA NEW ZEALAND TASMANIA &C, YOURS TRULY J. B. SARGENT HE ADDED A POSTSCRIPT: "I SEND THIS TO CARE OF H.E. SARGENT BECAUSE I REMEMBER HIS STREET AND DONOT REMEMBER YOUR ADDRESS — GIVE HIM AND FAMILY MY RESPECTS IN WHICH MY WIFE JOINS AS WELL AS

NATHAN SARGENT (1718-1799) OF LEICESTER, MASS., FOREBEAR OF THE HOMER SARGENTS, MARRIED IST HIS COUSIN MARY SARGENT, SISTER OF JOSEPH SARGENT (1716-1802), FOREBEAR OF THE JOSEPH SARGENTS. HE MARRIED 2D MARY DENNY, AUNT OF THE MARY DENNY WHO MARRIED JOSEPH SARGENT (1757-1787). A NUMBER OF INCIDENTS IN NATHAN'S LIFE HAVE BEEN TOLD IN SARGENTRIVIA. TO ALICE SARGENT TATE YE EDITOR IS INDEBTED FOR THE RECOLLECTIONS (OF WHICH THE FOLLOWING IS AN INSTALLMENT) WRITTEN DOWN IN 1849 BY NATHAN'S GRANDDAUGHTER, MISS ANNA HENSHAW, THEN 71, AND COPIED BY THE LATE JOHN SMITH SARGENT, TO WHOM THE FAMILY

IS INDEBTED FOR RESEARCHES INTO OUR ENGLISH ANCESTRY. "NATHAN SARGENT WAS CONSIDERED ONE OF THE HAND-SOMEST MEN OF HIS TIMES, HIS GOOD LOOKS IMPROVED ON ESPECIAL OCCASIONS BY NEATNESS AND ATTENTION TO DRESS. HE WORE THE NICEST OF BROADCLOTH WITH HIS SILVER SET OF STOCK KNEE AND SHOE BUCKLES AND BROACH A THREE CORNERED HAT AND A WHITE BUSH WIG. HE WAS FLUENT OF SPEECH AND FEW MEN WERE MORE FELICITOUS IN REPARTEE, BUT IN THE RECOLLECTION OF BY GONE ANECDOTES, THE PITH AND THE POINT ARE LOST IN THE RE-LATION. THE WRITER RECOLLECTS HEARING THE LATE REV. DR. SUMNER RELATE AN AMUSING SCENE TO HER GRAND-MOTHER, WHEN ON A VISIT TO HER GRANDDAUGHTER MRS. ANDREW H. WARD OF SHREWSBURY, MASS. IN THE DAYS OF THE REVOLUTION EVERY MAN WAS VOLUNTARILY A MINUTE MAN, AND WORCESTER WAS THE CENTRE OF COMMUNICATION. MR. SARGENT RESIDED AT A POINT WHERE HE RECEIVED AND DISSEMINATED THE STIRRING NEWS OF THOSE STIRRING TIMES. HE WAS OPEN FRANK AND INGENUOUS IN HIS MANNERS AND RECEIVED ALIKE THE CONFIDENCE OF THE BEGGAR AND THE COURTIER. HAVING RECEIVED AT ONE TIME IMPORTANT INFORMATION HE INSTANTLY MOUNTED HIS HORSE IN HIS MILLER'S COSTUME (HE HAD A GRIST MILL ON THE STREAM IN FRONT OF HIS HOUSE) AND SPEEDILY ARRIVED AT WORCESTER (FOUR MILES) WHERE AFTER COMMUNICATING THE INTELLIGENCE, HE WENT TO DEACON BRIDGES THE BARBERS SHOP FOR HIS NEW DRESSED BUSH WIG, AND WHERE HE MET DR. SUMNER ON A SIMILAR ERRAND. THE DR. REMARKED TO HIM THAT HE NEVER SAW HIM FROM HOME BEFORE IN A MILLER'S GARB, AND A DUSTY HAT, TO WHICH MR. SARGENT JOCOSELY REPLIED, 'AN HONEST MILLER NEVER NEED BE ASHAMED OF THE DUST THAT FELL ON HIS HAT (WHICH HAD A LARGE BRIM AND WAS BASON CROWNED). AN HONEST MILLER? SOME ONE JESTINGLY EXCLAIMED (FOR MR. SARGENT'S HONESTY AND INTEGRITY WERE NEVER DOUBTED). AN HONEST MILLER? DID YOU EVER HEAR THE BON MOT OF THE BOY THAT WENT TO MILL AND WHEN THE MILLER ASKED HIM IF HE KNEW ANYTHING, REPLIED THAT SOME THINGS HE KNEW AND SOME THINGS HE DID NOT KNOW. 'WELL SAYS THE MILLER, WHAT DO YOU KNOW? 'I KNOW, SAYS THE BOY, THAT MILLERS HAVE FAT HOGS. 'VERY WELL,' SAYS THE MILLER, 'AND WHAT DONT YOU KNOW? 'I DON'T KNOW WHOSE CORN THEY ARE FATTED ON, SAYS THE BOY. MR. SARGENT'S PIQUANT RETORT HAS SLIPPED FROM MY MEMORY. DR. SUMNER REMARKED IN THE COURSE OF THIS CONVERSATION, THAT HE WAS A MAN OF THE MOST UNVENDING (UN-BENDING? - ED.) FIRMNESS AND RIGED VIRTUE AND MADE OTHER FLATTERING OBSERVATIONS THAT WERE VERY GRATE-FUL TO THE FEELINGS OF THE AGED RELICT OF MR. SARGENT."

OUR ANCESTOR, SIR JOHN GIFFARD LE BOEF (ABOUT 1235-ABOUT 1300) OF TWYFORD, CO. BUCKS, ENGLAND, WAS THE SON OF OSBERT AND ISABEL DE BOKLAND GIFFARD. (SEE GENEALOGICAL CHART ON LAST PAGE OF SARGENTRIVIA OF MAY 25, 1949.) THE NAME OF HIS WIFE IS NOT NOW KNOWN. HE HAD A SON JOHN. HE WAS ENFEOFFED OF TWO PARTS OF A KNIGHT'S FEE IN TWYFORD BY ROBERT FITZNICHOLAS, STEWARD OF KING HENRY III, PRIOR TO 1272. ON MARCH 12, 1276 HE WAS MENTIONED AS OF TWYFORD IN THE CLOSE ROLLS, AND IN 1277 HE PETITIONED THAT THE SERVICE OF RALPH PIPARD SHOULD BE PERFORMED IN WEST WALES. IN 1284 HE WAS SUMMONED BY A WRIT OF QUO WARRANTO TO SHOW HIS RIGHT OF FRANK PLEDGE IN TWYFORD, WHEN HE PLEADED THE FEOFFMENT BY ROBERT FITZ NICHOLAS AND CALLED UPON ROBERT'S NEPHEW, RALPH PIPARD, TO WARRANT, BUT WAS ADJUDGED TO BE IN MERCY.
PIPARD SOUGHT IN 1289-90 THAT HE BE RESTORED. IN THE FEUDAL AID OF 1284-1286 THIS ANCESTOR HELD 152 VIRGATES OF LAND IN CHERNDON, CO. BUCKS, OF THE KING, AND 40 LIBRATES IN TWYFORD OF RALPHPIPARD. ON MAY 3, 1296, HE WAS KNIGHT OF THE SHIRE FOR BUCKS IN A PARLIAMENT AT WESTMINSTER, ONE OF THE EARLIEST PARLIAMENTS. IN THE ROLL OF ARMS IN THE TIME OF KING EDWARD I, KNOWN AS THE PLANCHE ROLL, HIS ARMS ARE GIVEN. (THE ABOVE IS FROM THE RESULTS OF GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH IN ENGLAND PUBLISHED IN NEW ENGLAND HISTORICAL AND GENEALOGICAL REGISTER IN 1921, VOL. 75.)
