HE IS EXPECTED BACK AT HIS HOME, 104 SUNSET LANE, HAVERFORD, PA., ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 28TH, AND WILL BE LAID UP AT HOME FOR SOME TIME.

WILLIAM ACKER RICE DEMING, SON OF LAURA RICE DEMING, IS ENGAGED TO BE MARRIED TO MISS PHYLLIS ANNE COLE, DAUGHTER OF PROFESSOR AND MRS. ELBERT C. COLE OF WILLIAMS COLLEGE. ARTHUR'S COURSE AT YALE WAS INTERRUPTED BY WORLD WAR II, IN WHICH HE SAW SERVICE IN THE PACIFIC AS A NAVY FLYING OFFICER. AFTER THE WAR HE RETURNED TO YALE MAJORING IN ENGLISH AND GRADUATING IN 1946. (GID) LORING, WROTE TO YE EDITOR FROM 1737 CAMBRIDGE ST., CAMBRIDGE, MASS., ON OCTOBER 6TH, GIVING MUCH LORING NEWS: "WE ENJOY READING "SARGENTRIVIA" AND REALIZE THAT IF YOU ARE TO KEEP UP WITH ALL THE LORING FAMILY DOINGS, SOMEONE MUST LET YOU KNOW WHAT WE'RE UP TO: GID HAS BEEN ADMITTED TO THE HARVARD BUSINESS SCHOOL, AFTER WORKING SINCE HIS FEBRUARY GRADUATION FROM HARVARD FOR KIDDER, PEABODY & Co. THIS NECESSITATED MOVING TO 1737 CAMBRIDGE STREET, CAMBRIDGE, TO ELIMINATE THE TIME CONSUMING TRAIN GOMMUTING TO AND FROM MANCHESTER. HE STUDIES FROM 7 A.M. TO II P.M., AND MY MAIN FUNCTION IS TO FEED HIM. IT SOUNDS TERRIBLE, BUT THE CASES (BASED ON ACTUAL BUSINESS EXPERIENCE) ARE INTERESTING, AS IS THE OTHER MORE TECHNICAL WORK AT THE SCHOOL. I AM TAKING COURSES, GENERALLY ENJOYING THE LEISURE TIME, WITH MANY OF MY RADCLIFFE CLASSMATES NEARBY. SO MUCH FOR THE GEORGE LORINGS! ROMEY AND CALEB ARE LIVING IN PRIDE'S CROSSING WHILE THEIR NEW HOUSE IS BEING BUILT THERE. ALL THE CHILDREN ARE WELL, AND VERY HANDSOME. JOE HAS GONE BACK FOR HIS JUNIOR YEAR AT MILTON ACADEMY, AND SUE IS WORKING AS A SECRETARY TO A HARVARD PROFESSOR (RIGHT AROUND THE CORNER FROM US ) AT THE PEABODY MUSEUM. THEY EXPECT TO FLY ABOUT THE END OF OCTOBER TO DETROIT, TO PICK UP A NEW OLDSMOBILE IN WHICH THEY PLAN TO DRIVE TO THE COAST ALONG THE NORTHERN ROUTE. LOUISE HAD THE MISFORTUNE SOME SEVEN OR EIGHT MONTHS AGO OF DISLOCATING A DISC IN HER BACK AND IS STILL WEAR-ING A BANDAGE.

HOWARD L. (PETER) SARGENT, JR., IS A SENIOR AT STANFORD AND PLANS TO ENTER MEDICAL SCHOOL IN 1951. HE WAS ON THE DEAN'S LIST FOR HIS SOPHOMORE YEAR. (DEAN'S LIST FOR JUNIOR YEAR IS NOT YET OUT.) HE IS A MEMBER OF DKE.

P. FORBES MCCANCE, SON OF MOLLY SARGENT MCCANCE, WHO GRADUATED FROM YALE LAST JUNE, IS IN THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF U.C.L.A. (UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT LOS ANGELES), STUDYING TO BECOME A TEACHER.

ELIZABETH (LIB) OWEN SARGENT, WIFE OF THOMAS D. SARGENT, TRAVELING IN A SLEEPING CAR ON THE NEW YORK CENTRAL LINES, WAS IN A TRAIN WRECK ON OCTOBER 5TH, CAUSED BY A TANK CAR WHICH JUMPED THE TRACK AND EXPLODED. LIB WAS UNINJURED AND WAS ABLE TO RENDER FIRST AID TO OTHERS. SHE WENT TO LAKE OWEN, WISCONSIN, TO VISIT HER FAMILY. REPORT IS THAT SHE IS QUITE A NIMROD AND BAGGED MANY PARTRIDGES.

JOSEPH BRADFORD SARGENT (1822-1907), GRANDFATHER OF YE EDITOR'S GENERATION, ENJOYED AN ARGU-MENT ESPECIALLY ON ECONOMIC SUBJECTS. HE BECAME AN ARDENT FREE-TRADER AND A MEMBER OF THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY ABOUT THE TIME (1884) THAT GROVER CLEVELAND APPEARED ON THE NATIONAL SCENE. HE WAS A MEMBER IN NEW HAVEN OF SOME KIND OF A FORUM WHERE MEMBERS DISCUSSED OR DEFENDED PROPOSITIONS ON ALL SORTS OF SUB-JECTS, GENERALLY ECONOMIC. A YOUNGER MEMBER OF THE GROUP WAS MR. FARNSWORTH, A REPUBLICAN AND PROTECT-ICNIST, WHO WAS A GREAT ADMIRER OF MR. SARGENT AND WOULD NOT RUN AGAINST HIM FOR PUBLIC OFFICE, THOUGH SUCCEEDING THE ELDER MAN, AFTER AN INTERVAL, AS MAYOR OF THE CITY. MR. FARNSWORTH TOLD OF THE FOLLOW-ING INCIDENT THAT OCCURRED AT ONE OF THE MEETINGS OF THE FORUM. THE GATHERING HAD BECOME A LITTLE TALKED OUT, AND THE MEETINGS SEEMED LIKELY, AS SENSED BY MR. SARGENT, TO DRIFT INTO A CONDITION OF INNOCUOUS DESUETUDE; SO DURING THIS OBSESSION HE REMARKED ONE EVENING THAT THE MEETINGS SEEMED WEAK IN MAJOR SUBJECTS, AND HE THEREFORE MOVED FORMALLY THAT A SOCIALIST BE ELECTED TO MEMBERSHIP. ON THE MOTION BEING SECONDED AND OPEN FOR DISCUSSION, A QUIET MAN-"AS MILD A MANNERED MAN AS EVER SCUTTLED SHIP OR CUT A THROAT"-AROSE SAYING THAT HE HAD BEEN A MEMBER OF THE GROUP FOR MUCH MORE THAN A YEAR, AND THAT HE WAS A PRONOUNCED SOCIALIST. THEREUPON MR. SARGENT SAID, IN DEFENCE OF HIS MOTION, THAT IF THIS MILD MANNERED MAN WAS A SOCIALIST, THEN HE WOULD AMEND HIS MOTION SO THAT IT WOULD READ THAT THEY ELECT AN ANARCHIST TO MEMBERSHIP, AND GET SOME "PEP" INTO THEIR DISCUSSIONS; AS HE HIMSELF LOVED AN ARGUMENT, AND HE WOULD LIKE TO JOIN IN THE TOUGHEST KIND OF A PROPOSITION AN ANARCHIST COULD OFFER. AND FOR HIMSELF WOULD ENJOY THE SCRIMMAGE. WHAT CAME OF THE MOTICN HAS NOT COME DOWN TO US.

AMONG THE PAPERS, MOSTLY GENEALOGICAL, ACQUIRED BY YE EDITOR BELONGING TO THE LATE JOHN SMITH SARGENT, COMPILER OF THE ENGLISH ANCESTRY PORTION OF THE 1895 SARGENT GENEALOGY, WAS A GENEALOGI-CAL CHART SHOWING HIS DESCENT (FROM FATHER TO SON) IN 121 GENERATIONS FROM ADAM AND EVE. THE LINE CAME DOWN THROUGH BEL! MAWR, KING OF BRITAIN ABOUT 100 B.C. THE DESCENT OF MOST OF US FROM THE LATTER TO GRIFFITH BOWEN (D. 1676) WAS SHOWN IN SARGENTRIVIA OF MARCH 15, 1950 (SEE ALSO SUPPLEMENTARY NOTE ON THE LAST PAGE OF SARGENTRIVIA OF MAY 18, 1950). FOR OUR DESCENT FROM GRIFFITH BOWEN (D. 1676) SEE SARGENTRIVIA OF MARCH 4, 1947, AND DECEMBER 15, 1943. THE LINE OF DESCENT FROM BELL MAWR OF JOHN SMITH SARGENT-AND LIKEWISE OTHER DESCENDANTS OF NATHAN SARGENT (1718-1799)-IS FROM BELL'S SON LLUDD AND COMES DOWN THROUGH ANOTHER BOWEN (RICHARD BOWEN, AN AMERICAN IMMIGRANT) AND THE WHEATONS .- THE NAMES IN THE ADAM TREE ARE IN JOHN SMITH SARGENT'S HANDWRITING, AND YE EDITOR'S INTERPRETATION OF THE SPELLING, BELOW, MAY IN SOME CASES BE FAULTY. THE CHART IS IN DUPLICATE, ONE COPY APPEARING ON TWO AND A HALF PAGES IN A NOTE BOOK CONTAINING OTHER GENEALOGICAL MEMORANDA, AND THE OTHER WRITTEN ON BOTH SIDES OF A SHEET OF PAPER. A THIRD COPY, LOANED BY ALICE SARGENT TATE WITH OTHER PAPERS THAT BELONGED TO HER FATHER, IS A BIT CLEARER AS TO SPELLING AND CONTAINS TWO ADDITIONAL NOTES. THE LATTER COPY IS TITLED "CURIOSITIES OF GENEALOGY", WHICH SHOWS THAT JOHN SMITH SARGENT, WHO WAS AN EXPERIENCED GENEALOGIST, HAD HIS TONGUE IN HIS CHEEK WHEN COMPILING THE CHART. REFERENCES ARE GIVEN: "THE BIBLE, WARRINGTON'S HISTORY OF WALES, DALE'S CASTLE MSS., LEWIS DWN GOLDEN GROVE, VOL. 1, NICHOLS' ANNALS OF WALES, JOHN WYNN AP DOWD AP GRIFFITH, BOWEN GEN." YE EDITOR HAS NOT SEEN THE CASTLE MSS. NOR GOLDEN GROVE, AND DOES NOT UNDERSTAND THE REFERENCE TO JOHN WYNN, ETC. GENESIS, CHAPTER V, HAS SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT SPELL-ING IN THREE NAMES; 4. CAINAN, 5. MAHALALEEL AND 8. METHUSALAH, AND CHAPTER X GIVES THE NAMES OF FOUR SONS OF 12. JAVAN, BUT DOES NOT MENTION 13. SEPTUM. PERHAPS THE REFERENCE TO THE BIBLE ENDS WITH NUMBER 12. YE EDITOR ONCE HAD A REQUEST FOR A LIST OF ANCESTRAL NAMES FROM A MEMBER OF THE FAMILY (WHO AT THE TIME WAS AN EXPECTANT MOTHER CONSIDERING A NAME FOR THE UNBORN CHILD). THIS CHART ADDS A WEALTH OF UNUSUAL MALE NAMES. BELOW IS SHOWN THE LINE DOWN TO BELI MAWR.

OVERLEAF ARE FACSIMILES OF PAGES 195 AND 196 IN THE 1866 CATALOGUE OF SARGENT & CO., 70 BEEKMAN STREET, NEW YORK. THE LATTER WAS THE MERCHANDISING PARTNERSHIP WHICH SOLD THE PRODUCTS OF THE MANU-FACTURING CORPORATIONS OF SARGENT & COMPANY (OF NEW HAVEN, CONN.) AND OF THE SARGENT CARD CLOTHING COMPANY (OF WORCESTER, MASS.) AND ALSO SERVED AS SALES AGENT FOR MANY OTHER MANUFACTURERS. ON THIS PAGE 196, OVER, APPEARS A COPY OF THE BILL OF SALE OF THE HAND CARD BUSINESS FROM JOHN WHITTEMORE & CO., DATED APRIL 18, 1859. THE TWO HALF MOON DESIGNS IN THE FACSIMILES APPEARED TOGETHER ALSO IN THE CATA-LOGUE OF 1869 AND PERHAPS IN SOME OTHER. BUT THE NEW YORK CARD MANUFACTORY CUT APPEARED ALONE IN EARLIER CATALOGUES AND THE SARGENT & WHITTEMORE CUT ALONE IN LATER CATALOGUES. IN TRYING TO DISCOVER HOW THESE TWO FIRMS FITTED INTO THE SARGENT HAND CARD PICTURE (A BRIEF STORY OF THE BUSINESS APPEARED IN SARGENTRIVIA OF JUNE 26, 1950), YE EDITOR FOUND IN A TYPED SARGENT HISTORY COMPILED BY THE LATE HENRY BRADFORD SARGENT (1651-1927) THE FOLLOWING: "IN 1858 JOHN H. WHITTEMORE, MANUFACTURER OF HAND CARDS, OF PATERSON, N.J., WAS BOUGHT OUT BY SARGENT & BRO. FOR NEARLY \$6,000.00, AND THE MACHINERY AND BUSINESS MOVED TO LEICESTER, MASS. WILLIAM AND JAMES WHITTEMORE OF LEICESTER WERE BOUGHT OUT BY SARGENT & BRO. IN 1858. THE WHITTE-MORES OF LEICESTER WERE ONE FAMILY, OF CAMBRIDGE, MASS., ANOTHER AND OF PATERSON, N.J., STILL ANOTHER. IN ANOTHER TYPED HISTORY, PROBABLY WRITTEN EARLIER, AND NOT QUITE AS ACCURATE, WAS THE FOLLOWING: "IN APRIL 18,1859, SARGENT & CO. ACQUIRED FROM THE ASSIGNEE, ALL THE RIGHT, TITLE AND INTEREST, INCLUDING TRADEMARKS, OF THE HAND CARD BUSINESS OF THE NEW YORK CARD MFG. CO., SUCCESSORS TO THOMAS WHITTEMORE & Co., IN TURN SUCCESSORS TO SARGENT & WHITTEMORE AND THEREBY ENLARGED THE MANUFACTURING BUSINESS OF SARGENT & BRO. OF LEICESTER, MASS." YE EDITOR ALSO CAME ACROSS A LIST OF QUESTIONS WRITTEN BY HENRY B. SARGENT ON ONE OF HIS 3 X 5 CARDS LABELED "ASK GHS". (GEORGE HENRY SARGENT WAS THE LAST LIVING PARTNER IN SARGENT & BROTHER, PREDECESSOR OF THE SARGENT CARD CLOTHING CO.) ONE OF THESE QUESTIONS WAS "WHO COMPOSED THE FIRM OF SARGENT & WHITTEMORE?" AND THE ANSWER ON THE CARD WAS "FAKE". WHICH OBVIOUSLY MEANS THAT "SARGENT & WHITTEMORE" AND "SARGENT & WHITTEMORE HAND CARD CO." WERE SIMPLY TRADEMARKS OR BRAND NAMES. THERE WAS PROBABLY SOME SALES VALUE IN COUPLING THE NAMES. YE EDITOR BELIEVES THAT "NEW YORK CARD MANUFACTORY" AND "THOS. WHITTEMORE & CO." VERY LIKELY THESE HALF MOON AND THE "NO. 10 COTTON" DESIGNS WERE STAMPED ON THE HAND CARDS. JOSEPH SARGENT (1716-1802) MARRIED HANNAH WHITTEMORE (1724-1757), SO THE LESCESTER WHITTEMORES WERE PROBABLY RELATED TO THE SARGENTS. (SEE GENEALOGICAL CHART IN SARGENTRIVIA OF DECEMBER 15, 1943.)
