

SYDNEY F. A FOG—SMOG CURTAIN STALLED HUNDREDS OF CARS, TRUCKS AND JITTERY DRIVERS BECAUSE VISIBILITY ACTUALLY ENDED AT A CAR'S OWN RADIATOR. THE ACCIDENT COUNT HAS SO FAR BEEN TERRIFIC. SITTING DOWN AT 1:30 TO MOLLY'S DELICIOUS TURKEY DINNER WERE THE THREE MCCANCES OF LONG BEACH—BILL, MOLLY, AND MARY; THE THREE MCCANCES OF PASADENA—FORBES, JENELLA, AND TOMMY (II MONTHS); THE THREE SARGENTS OF LOS ANGELES—PETE (HOWARD), FLORENCE, AND LOUISE; AND YOURS TRULY, THE LONE WOLF. YOUNG TOMMY DIDN'T REALLY SIT AT TABLE. HE BURBLED AND ROMPED ON THE FLOOR. THE CYNOSURE OF ALL EYES, HE IS A STURDY YOUNG MAN WHO LOOKS NOT TOO MUCH LIKE HIS MA OR PA BUT RESEMBLES BOTH. PETER (HOWARD, JR.) SARGENT, OUR BUDDING MEDIC, WAS SORELY MISSED AT THE GATHERING.

"FORBES MCCANCE'S JOB WITH BRIDGEPORT BRASS CO. IN LOS ANGELES IS ACCORDING TO HIM INTRIGUING AND SATISFACTORY. JENELLA ENJOYS TEACHING IN A PASADENA SCHOOL. LOUISE IS CRAZY ABOUT HER
SECRETARIAL WORK FOR CARNATION. MARY LOOKED LOVELY IN A NEW BLUE DRESS AND, AT MY RIGHT, KEPT ME
INTERESTED IN HER RECENT ACTIVITIES. FLORENCE, AT MY LEFT AT TABLE, CAUGHT ME UP ON THE H.L.S.
FAMILY DOINGS. I HAVE NEVER SEEN H.L.S. IN BETTER FORM. HE HAS ACQUIRED A BIT OF EXTRA WEIGHT
PHYSICALLY, AND 'CARRIES A LOT OF WEIGHT' OTHERWISE WITH ALL WHO KNOW HIM. BILL AND MOLLY AS HOST
AND HOSTESS ALWAYS 'CARRY THE BALL' WITH GRACE, CHARM, AND AFFECTION. THIS DAY WAS NO EXCEPTION.
BEFORE THE PARTY BROKE UP WE WERE INVITED TO THE H.L.S. HOME IN L.A. FOR DINNER ON THE 20TH OF
DECEMBER, AND AFTERWARD A SHOWING OF COLORED SLIDES OF THE RECENT EUROPEAN WANDERINGS OF OUR PETER
SARGENT AND FRIEND, PETER TO BE THE LECTURER, SO ANOTHER NICE FAMILY GET-TOGETHER IS IN THE OFFING.

"AS FOR ME, I RETIRED LAST DECEMBER 31ST. STOOD THE INACTIVITY FOR ONE MONTH, THEN TOOK TO GARDENING. LOVE IT! FOUR HOURS A DAY IN OTHER PEOPLES! YARDS DOING THIS AND THAT TO URGE THESE AND THOSE TO BLOOM. RECENTLY I ACQUIRED A FINE 21" SCREEN R.C.A. IV SET FOR MY SMALL HOME. I NOT ONLY ENJOY IT, BUT IT HAS RAISED TO THREE THE NUMBER OF MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS ON THE PREMISES—NAMELY, TELEVISION, PIANO, AND PLUMBING. WE WISH ALL SARGENTS EVERYWHERE A VERY MERRY CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR, AND FOR YOU TWO PLEASE ADD OUR THANKS AGAIN FOR SARGENTRIVIA."

THE FOLLOWING FROM THE DIARY OF LIEUT. COL. JOSEPH SCRANTON TATE, JR., SON OF ALICE SARGENT TATE, IS A CONTINUTATION OF HIS ACCOUNT IN SARGENTRIVIA OF NOVEMBER 22 OF THE TRANSFER OF HIS BOMBER GROUP FROM ENGLAND TO ALGERIA ON DECEMBER 7. "WE SAW MANY BEAUTIFUL WHITE TOWNS AND ROLLING HILLS, MANY OF THEM SHELL POCKED AND RIDGED WITH TRENCHES FROM THE CIVIL WAR. WE SAW SCARCELY ANY SIGNS OF LIFE ANYWHERE, EXCEPT A FEW FIRES, EITHER IN THE WOODS OR HILLS, EVERY NOW AND THEN. AS WE NEARED THE EASTERN COAST OF SPAIN THE CLOUDS AND MOUNTAINS BOTH BEGAN TO BUILD UP AND THE CLOUDS GOT TO AROUND SIX OR SEVEN THOUSANDS AND THE MOUNTAINS GOT MUCH HIGHER. WAY OUT TO THE NORTH, LEFT OF OUR COURSE, WE PASSED A BEAUTIFUL HIGH SNOWCAPPED PEAK WHICH LIFTED ITS HEAD ABOVE THE CLOUDS SEVERAL THOUSAND FEET. SOON - ABOUT TEN PAST THREE WE CROSSED THE COAST AROUND CAPE SACRITIF AND ROLLED OUT OVER THE MEDITERRANEAN. MY FIRST GLIMPSE OF IT SHOWED IT TO BE EASILY AS BEAUTIFUL AS I HAD EXPECTED IT TO BE, AND THERE WERE NICE WHITE CAPS ALL OVER THE SURFACE. I WAS ALONE AT THIS TIME, BUT GRADU-ALLY ALL OUR SHIPS BEGAN TO CONVERGE AND SOON WE HAD TWELVE OF US WITHIN SIGHT OF EACH OTHER. I IDENTIFIED THEM AS ALL 328TH AND 409TH, EXCEPT THE COLONEL'S FLIGHT AND FIGURED HIM AHEAD OF US. ATTILLIO WANTED TO MAKE SOME PICTURES SO I BEGAN FLYING ALL OVER THE SKY GETTING SHOTS OF FORMATIONS. BEN RIGGS, STEW AND MURPHY P. WERE TOGETHER AND I THINK WE REALLY GOT SOME GOOD SHOTS OF THEM. WE MADE A LANDFALL OFF THE TIP OF MEDILLA IN SPANISH MORRACO, AND HEADED FOR OUR NEW BASE ACROSS A LITTLE BAY. WE HIT LAND AGAIN SOON AND WERE SHORTLY OVER THE LARGE DRIED-OUT LAKE BED WHICH IS SUCH A PROMINENT LANDMARK HERE. IN THE LAKE BED AS WE FLEW OVER I SAW A NUMBER OF CRACKED UP SHIPS, SOME SPITS AND SOMETHING WHICH RESEMBLED A LOCKHEAD. WE SOON LOCATED THE FIELD WHICH IS SITUATED IN THE VALLEY WHICH IS FORMED BY A MOUNTAIN RANGE TO THE SOUTH AND SOME HIGH HILLS TO THE NORTH, JUST SHORT OF THE COAST. WE WENT INTO SCHELON, CIRCLED THE FIELD ONCE AND BUZZED IT AS WELL AS IT HAS EVER

BEEN BUZZED I GUESS, AND THEN MADE AN IMMENSE PATTERN TO LAND. WE DAMN NEAR CROSSED OVER ORAN WHICH IS 15 OR 20 MILES FROM THE FIELD ON OUR DOWN LAND LEG, AND WE DID CROSS OVER LA SENIA, ANOTHER AIR-DROME NEAR ORAN. WE LANDED EAST ON THE EASTWEST RUNWAY, AND ON CUTTING THE MOTORS HAD BEEN IN THE AIR 8:50. I LEFT THE CREW AT THE SHIP AND REPORTED TO OPERATIONS, GOT LINED UP ON WHAT TO DO, AND WENT BACK TO THE SHIP FOR THE CREW AND EATING AND SLEEPING TOOLS. WE HAD LANDED AT ABOUT 5:10 AND AFTER WE ATE AND GOT OUR SLEEPING QUARTERS LINED UP IT WAS QUITE DARK OUT. THE 330TH BEGAN TO COME IN AND SO DID THE WEATHER. ALL OF THEM MANAGED TO GET IN EXCEPT OX JOHNSON AND BOB HOOVER, WHOM WE THINK HAVE LANDED AT GIB. ALFRED ASCH, FLYING IN "WHAM DAMN", SAYS HE RAN INTO INSTRUMENTS ON HIS BASE LEG AT 1000 FEET WITH WHEELS AND FLAPS DOWN. THEY WERE ALL LUCKY TO GET IN. THEY HAD HAD JUST AS LOUSEY A BRIEFING AS WE, AND DIDN'T EVEN KNOW THAT THE FIELD HAD AN AMERICAN RADIO RANGE. THE FOOD WASN'T BAD, BUT BOY WHAT QUARTERS! THERE WERE NO BEDS WHEN WE ARRIVED, A FEW OF US WERE LUCKY ENOUGH TO BE NONMILITARY AND BRING A BEDDING ROLL (AFTER BEING ORDERED NOT TO) BUT UNFORTUNATELY I WAS NOT ONE OF THESE. SOME MANAGED TO GET FRENCH ARMY BEDS WHICH ARE OF THREE TYPES. I - A HEAD PIECE AND FOOT PIECE OF STEEL WITH THREE SOLID BOARDS!- 2 - THE SAME FOOT PIECES WITH SIX LENGTHWISE STEEL SLATS! AND 3 - THE OLD USUAL BEDSTEAD WITH NO SPRINGS! I GOT ONE OF THE LATTER AND TIED ONE OF MY TWO BLANKETS AT THE FOUR CORNERS AND MADE A HAMMOCK. OF COURSE PART OF MY POSTERIOR COUCHED THE COLD CEMENT FLOOR ON TESTING, BUT IT WAS BETTER THAN SOME WHO VIEW THE FLOOR AS A BED IN ITSELF. THIS PLACE EVIDENTLY RESISTED CAPTURE TO NO SMALL EXTENT. THERE ARE A NUMBER OF BLOWN UP AS WELL AS SHOT UP FRENCH PLANES HERE - AS WELL AS HOLES IN A LOT OF THE BUILDINGS, AND IN SOME PLACES, BLOOD STAINS ON THE WALLS AND FLOORS. THERE ARE NO LIGHTS IN THIS PLACE AND I AM WRITING BY CANDLELIGHT. WASHING ETC. IS QUITE PRIMITIVE AND ALL DRINKING WATER IS CONTROLLED. WASHING WATER IS BAD - SULPHUR - AND SMELLS LIKE THREE OLD ROTTEN EGGS. ASIDE FROM THIS, I THINK I'M GOING TO LIKE IT HERE. IT IS WARM IN THE DAYTIME THEY SAY, BUT IT HAS BECOME QUITE COOL TONIGHT. I SAW A FEW LOOSE ARABS BOTH WALKING AND IN SOME SORT OF CART BEING PULLED BY A LITTLE & SIZE DONKEY. THEY SAY WE CAN GET EGGS AND TANGE-RINES FROM THEM ALL THE TIME. I ATE ABOUT 10 TANGERINES TONIGHT. STEW HAS A COT NEXT TO MINE, THE MAJOR SLEEPS ON THE FLOOR NEXT TO ME AND THE WHOLE REST OF THE SQUADRON OFFICERS SLEEP IN THIS ONE BIG ROOM TOO. THE ENLISTED MEN, EXCEPT FOR THE MEN GUARDING THE SHIPS, SLEEP IN THE SAME BUILDING, BUT THE OTHER SIDE FROM US. THE 30 IST IS HERE AS ARE THE 97TH, AND HAVE BEEN SEEING QUITE A LITTLE ACTION SO FAR. WE WOULD GO OUT TOMORROW EXCEPT THAT IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO UNLOAD THE SHIPS, CHECK THEM AND BOMB UP TONIGHT. WE WILL READY THEM TOMORROW AND PROBABLY GO OUT ON THE 9TH FOR OUR FIRST AFFAIR IN THIS THEATRE. | MUST GET TO BED NOW AS IT IS QUITE LATE AND I AM TIRED AS HELL. GOODNIGHT DAR-LING. | WOULD GIVE ALL OF AFRICA TO BE WITH YOU NOW. | LOVE YOU VERY MUCH."

BROOKLYN. MAY 10th, SATURDAY, 1851. PLEASANT. WIND RIGHT. HAVE BEEN ENGAGED AS USUAL MOST OF THE DAY AT 24 CLIFF St., N.Y. I HAVE ALSO BEEN OVER TO "BARNUM'S MUSEUM" THIS EVE. BARNUM IS CERTAINLY "A TRUMP" IN THE HUMBUG LINE. THERE WAS PRODUCED AT THE MUSEUM THIS EVE. THE MORAL DRAMA CALLED THE "DRUNKARD", WHICH IS NOTHING OF ITSELF AND WAS MURDERED THIS EVE. IN ITS PERFORMANCE AT THE MUSEUM. THREE EVENINGS IN A WEEK TO CROWDED HOUSES AND THERE SEEMS TO BE NO DIMINATION IN THE ENTHUSIASM MANIFESTED ON BEHALF OF THE FAIR SWEDE. I HAVE NOT HEARD HER HERE YET, BUT INTEND TO GO SOON. HEARD IN BOSTON LAST OCTOBER. MAILED A LETTER, TO-DAY, TO SARAH S. EVE. AT HOME.
