SHE WORE A FINGERTIP LENGTH VEIL WHICH FELL FROM A BANDEAU OF LACE. MISS DEBORAH WIEPERT OF BRANFORD WAS MAID OF HONOR. THE BRIDESMAIDS WERE MISS LEE MCCANDLESS OF HAMDEN, MRS. WILLIAM ERHART OF HARWINTON, MRS. ROBERT LEVINSON OF NEW YORK, MISS CAROL CUSHMAN OF WINDSOR, VT., MRS. DONALD GOSS OF WATERBURY, AND NATALIE MOORE BABBITT (WIFE OF SAMUEL F.) OF NEW HAVEN. ALL THE ATTENDANTS WORE WHITE LACE GOWNS WITH INSERTS OF WHITE SHANTUNG FALLING IN BACK FROM TWO BUCKLES AT THE WAISTLINE. THE BRIDE AND HER ATTENDANTS

FITZGERALD OF LITCHFIELD, WILLIAM ERHART OF HARWINTON, EVANS WOOLEN OF NEW CANAAN, WINTHROP P. CANNON OF NEW HAVEN, HERBERT M. NOYES OF PLEASANTVILLE, N.Y., WILLIAM C. GULLIVER OF CHESHIRE, JAMES HICKOX OF NEW YORK AND LITCHFIELD, WALTER FREY OF PHILADELPHIA, AND TIMOTHY SMITH OF THOMASTON. WHEN YVONNE AND TOM LEFT FOR THEIR WEDDING TRIP SHE WORE A BEIGE COLORED DRESS OF SHANTUNG AND A SHORT SLEEVED RED DUSTER LINED WITH BEIGE. THE ENGAGEMENT WAS REPORTED IN SARGENTRIVIA OF APRIL 21. THEY EXPECT TO LIVE IN LITCHFIELD, WHERE TOM IS A PRACTICING ARCHITECT.

STEVIA WARREN SARGENT, DAUGHTER OF JOSEPH WEIR SARGENT AND PHEBE DOWNS SARGENT, WAS MARRIED ON SATURDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 18, TO ROBERT GORDON LESHER, SON OF MRS. GRANVILLE S. FOSS OF CHAPPAQUA, N.Y., AND THE LATE ROBERT F. LESHER. THE MARRIAGE TOOK PLACE IN THE PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL CHURCH OF THE REDEEMER IN BRYN MAWR, PA. THE REVEREND DR. SHE CARRIED WHITE ORCHIDS, GYPSOPHILA AND IVY. PHEBE SARGENT HARDING, SISTER OF THE BRIDE, WAS MATRON OF HONOR, MISS SOPHIE G. VESSELAGO WAS MAID OF HONOR, AND SUZANNE LOUISE HINKLEY, COUSIN OF THE BRIDE, WAS THE BRIDESMAID. THEY WERE ATTIRED IN BOUFFANT DRESSES OF MAIZE TAFFETA, WITH FLORAL HEADDRESSES TO MATCH THEIR BOUQUETS OF CAVALIER ROSES AND IVY. ANNE FOSS, SISTER OF THE BRIDEGROOM, AND ANNE BOULLEMET HOWARD WERE JUNIOR BRIDESMAIDS, WORE MAIZE TAFFETA FROCKS WITH EMERALD GREEN NET, AND CARRIED ROSES AND IVY TO MATCH THE BANDEAUX IN THEIR HAIR.

HARDING, 3D, OF HAVERFORD, BROTHER-IN-LAW OF THE BRIDE, AND WILLIAM L. MEFFERT, 3D, OF OLD GREENWICH, CONN., NEPHEW OF THE BRIDE. THE BRIDE HAS RECENTLY GRADUATED FROM MOUNT HOLYOKE COLLEGE, AND THE BRIDEGROOM FROM YALE.

SHE MANAGED SOMEHOW TO PULL HERSELF UPSTAIRS AND INTO HER BEDROOM, WHERE YE ASSISTANT EDITOR FOUND HER THE NEXT MORNING ON THE FLOOR. SHE IS NOW IN THE GRACE-NEW HAVEN HOSPITAL WITH HER LEG IN TRACTION. SHE BROKE HER OTHER HIP FIVE YEARS AGO.

LAURA CUMMING NORTHEY, DAUGHTER OF LAURA BAILEY CUMMING, WITH JOHN, HER HUSBAND, AND MARY NORTHEY, JOHN'S MOTHER, SPENT THE NIGHT OF JUNE 20 AT THE PUBLICATION OFFICE. THEY WERE ON A VACATION MOTOR TRIP. IT WAS THEIR FIRST TIME IN NEW ENGLAND. THEY ARRIVED WHILE YE EDITORS WERE ATTENDING THE YALE-HARVARD BASEBALL GAME ON THE LAST DAY OF THE CLASS REUNION WEEKEND. (A DETERMINED HARVARD TEAM WON 4-2, HAVING BEEN SET BACK TWICE BY YALE IN CAMBRIDGE.) THE NORTHEYS MANAGED TO MEET DURING THEIR BRIEF STAY A SAMPLING OF LAURA'S MANY NEW HAVEN COUSINS. LAURA AND JOHN LIVE AT 612 WESTWOOD STREET, HIGH POINT, N.C., WITH THEIR FOUR CHILDREN (WHO WERE PICTURED IN SARGENTRIVIA OF MAY 23).

LIEUT. COL. JOSEPH SCRANTON TATE, JR., SON OF ALICE SARGENT TATE, ON DECEMBER 18, 1942, THE DAY AFTER THE RAID REPORTED IN SARGENTRIVIA OF APRIL 21 AND MAY 23, FLEW HIS B-24 LIBERATOR, NAMED BALL OF FIRE, JR., FROM GAMBUT TO FAYID, A BRITISH AIR FIELD ON THE SUEZ CANAL 20 MILES FROM ISMALIA, TO HAVE A BOMB BAY TANK INSTALLED. THE FOLLOWING QUOTATION IS FROM HIS DIARY — HE WAS STILL 1ST LIEUTENANT — OF DECEMBER 20, 1942.

"RIGHT NOW I SHOULD SAY THAT TODAY WAS A DAY TO END ALL DAYS. I WOKE UP EARLY THIS MORNING AND WENT OUT ALL PREPARED TO FLY BACK HERE TO GAMBUT — THEY HAD INSTALLED THE BOMB BAY TANK AND DECIDED TO PULL A HUNDRED HOUR AND CHANGE THE PLUGS ON BOF JR. — SOON WHEN I GOT OUT TO THE SHIP HALF THE NEW PLUGS WERE IN AND ALL THE OLD ONES WERE OUT. WE COULDN'T GET OFF UNTIL NOON SO I SET ABOUT DRYING MY CLOTHES WHICH BLEW DOWN FROM THE CLOTHESLINE IN A RAINSTORM DURING THE NIGHT AND ARE NOW DIRTY AND FULL OF SAND AGAIN! I HUNG THEM ALL OVER THE SHIP. I TOOK SOME PICTURES OF THE NEW INSIGNIA PAINTED ON THE SHIP — BRITISH MARKINGS ON THE TAIL AND THE STAR NOW WHITE AGAIN SO THAT THE BRITISH WON'T SHOOT US DOWN. THE FILM WHICH I GOT YESTERDAY I NEGLECTED TO MENTION I THINK — ALFRED AND I EACH GOT A ROLL WHICH COST US A SMALL FORTUNE. THE DEALER SAID THAT IF IT WAS POSSIBLE FOR US TO GET BACK TO ISMALIA TODAY WE COULD EACH GET SIX ROLLS! OF COURSE WE WEREN'T ABLE TO GET BACK. WE HAD DINNER AT FAYID — SIMMER, MURPH P, RINEHART AND I HAD WORK TO DO ON OUR SHIPS SO WE COULDN'T LEAVE WITH THE REST EARLY THIS MORNING. AT DINNER I RAN INTO CAPT. WAGNER CLASS OF '40 WHO IS A WEATHER OFFICER HERE. HE WAS QUITE BITTER ABOUT IT ALL, BUT GLAD TO BE HERE. ALSO AT DINNER THE

MAJOR TOLD ME TO STICK AROUND AND CARRY A COOK BACK HERE TO GAMBUT. WE MET THE COOKS DOWN AT THE TOWN AFTER DINNER AND LOADED THEM ON. I HAD SIXTEEN MEN ON BOARD WITH ALL THEIR BAGGAGE. WE WERE REALLY LOADED DOWN. WORTHINGTON WAS THE NAME OF MY COOK BY THE WAY. HE IS A NORTH CAROLINA BOY. WE FLEW OUT TO WADI NATRUN THROUGH THE CORRIDOR AND THEN FLEW SOUTH ALONG THE DEMARCATION LINE OF THE DESERT AND NILE VALLEY UNTIL WE FOUND THE PYRAMIDS AND THE SPHINX. WE WERE WITHIN TEN MILES OF CAIRO SO WE HAD TO WATCH OUT FOR BRITISH FIGHTERS. WE FLEW WELL SOUTH OF THE THREE MAIN PYRAMIDS AND SPHINX AND SAW A NUMBER OF SMALLER PYRAMIDS IN ALL STATES OF REPAIR AND DISREPAIR. THE MAJOR CIRCLED OVER THEM SEVERAL TIMES AND WE DID THREE TIMES OURSELVES. THEY ARE RIGHT ON THE EDGE OF THE DESERT TO THE WEST OF CAIRO. THEY SEEMED TO BE ABOUT 500' HIGH AND MUCH ROUGHER THAN I HAD IMAGINED WE BUZZED DOWN REAL LOW AND SHOT SOME PICTURES OF THE SPHINX — IT, HE OR SHE HAS ITS CHIN ALL SAND-BAGGED UP IN CASE OF A BOMBING I GUESS. THERE WERE THOUSANDS OF TENTS ON THE EDGE OF THE DESERT NEAR THEM — IT LOOKED AS THOUGH THE ENGLISH HAD A BIG RESERVE FORCE IN THERE. WE CIRCLED AGAIN WHILE ATTILIO TOOK SOME MORE PICTURES AND CURLEY BOOKER TOOK A COUPLE WITH HIS CAMERA AND I WITH MINE AND THEN WE HEADED OUT 285° ACROSS THE DESERT. WE SAW MORE EVIDENCE OF THE CIVILIZATION OF EGYPT OUT THERE — THE OUTLINES OF RUINED VILLAGES ETC. WERE PLAIN IN THE SAND AND THERE WERE ALSO A FEW SMALLER PYRAMIDS OUT THERE. WE PASSED OVER THE MARSH LANDS WHERE THE BRITISH TRIED TO TRAP ROMMEL WHEN HE WAS SO CLOSE TO ALEXANDRIA AND THE NILE. WHEN WE CAME TO THE BATTLEFIELDS WE GOT DOWN TO 200' OR LESS TO LOOK AT THE WRECKAGE STREWN ABOUT — PLANES, TANKS, TRUCKS, GUNS, TRENCHES ETC. WERE EVERYWHERE. AFTER 3:25 WE LANDED HERE AT GAMBUT AT ABOUT 4:40. JERK CAME OUT IN A JEEP AND TOOK THE MAJOR OFF SHIP AND TOLD US A TRUCK WOULD BE OUT FOR US. WELL IT IS ABOUT TWO MILES FROM THE SHIP TO THE TENT AREA SO WE COULDN'T CARRY ALL OUR HEAVY JUNK IN AND WE WAITED DAMN NEAR TWO HOURS FOR SOME TRANSPORT WHICH NEVER CAME. I SENT FLUBBER IN FOR A TRUCK AND FINALLY WE GOT IN ONLY TO FIND THAT WE HAD TO GO RIGHT BACK OUT AND LOAD THE SHIP FOR A RAID TONIGHT. NO ONE HAD EATEN AND WE HAD BEEN UP AND WORKING ALL DAY AND WERE PLENTY TIRED — BUT WE GOT TO WORK AND WERE ALL READY TO GO. WE WENT TO THE BRIEFING — GOT BRIEFED TO BOMB SOUSSE — A PORT IN TUNISIA SOUTH OF BIZERTA AND TUNIS — JUST A SECOND AFTER THE BRIEFING WAS OVER THEY CALLED THE RAID OFF FROM CAIRO BECAUSE OF BAD WEATHER AND I WAS A GLAD CHICKEN. TOMMY AND I WHIPPED BACK HERE TO OUR TENT AND MADE OUR BEDS ALL READY. WE WERE SUPPOSED TO GO OUT ALONE ON THIS RAID AND IT WOULD HAVE BEEN A TEN HOUR AFFAIR WITH A 9:30 TAKEOFF. NOW IT IS ABOUT ELEVEN O'CLOCK AND I INTEND TO GET PLENTY OF THAT TEN HOUR RAID IN BED — SETTLE JUST CAME BY AND SAID IT WAS LUCKY WE COULDN'T GO. OUR BOMB BAY TANK PUMP WAS IN BACKWARDS SO WE WOULD HAVE BEEN SUCKING GAS OUT OF THE ENGINE INSTEAD OF OUT OF THE TANKS —! WELL GOODNIGHT DARLING — I'M FOR BED. I LOVE YOU VERY MUCH."

REFERENCE: ANCESTRAL ROOTS OF SIXTY COLONISTS, (2D ED. 1951) BY FREDERICK LEWIS WEIS.

FERGUS THE GREAT, SON OF ERC (FERGUS MOR MAC EARCA), CROSSED FROM DALRIEDA IN IRELAND OVER INTO SCOTLAND IN THE YEAR 496, AND BECAME THE FIRST KING OF THE DALRIAD SCOTS, 496-499.

DAMANGART (DANGARDUS), KING OF SCOTS, 499-504 = FEDELMIA, DAU. OF ECHY (EUGENIUS) MOGMEDON, KING OF IRELAND.

GAVRAN (GORANUS), KING OF SCOTS, 538-560
